The stark difference between those two birthday parties kickstarted Grace Klein Community.

A month later, we began by providing 58 families with food support. We said yes to do the right thing by God and everyone.

If I had understood the power of a compounding yes, I may have said "no" and missed out on the incredible life we have been living since October 2009. A yes seems pretty simple, but often a yes can take courage, sacrifice, or a step into the great unknown.

Our yes has evolved into local and global impact allowing us to love and care about people all around the world. The fun part is all our Global Partners are inner-connected and care deeply about one another.



Grace Klein Community met Caitlin Koné as a single woman through her Atlanta, GA, house church and built a longtime relationship with her which evolved into becoming a Global Partner of Grace Klein Community when she began serving Jesus as an educator in West Africa.

While in Africa, she met and married Enza Koné and they are now working together with Grace Klein Community to begin sports camps in Ivory Coast which will ultimately launch Koinonia Man Community Christian School.

In 2007, Grace Klein Construction, Inc. met Agrippa and Jeanette Phiri and began a relationship which evolved into a longstanding global partnership with Grace Klein Community from the inception of Grace Klein Community as a 501(c)3 non-profit in April 2010.

Kwathu Children's Home is a non-profit, community faith-based home in Livingstone, Zambia which provides shelter, education, psychosocial support, care for HIV-infected and affected children, and life skills to vulnerable children in a healthy, stable and safe environment. Kwathu is a Nyanja word from the Eastern Province of Zambia meaning 'our home or place' and provides a loving and caring family environment for children aged 2-17 years.

The sales proceeds support Kwathu Ministries, which currently offers free education to over 225 children and provides two complimentary meals daily. Kwathu is also home to approximately 20 orphaned and vulnerable children.
